- Consults with supervisor when ethical dilemmas arise.
- Adheres to agency and professional codes of conduct.

III. Interpersonal Skills

- Communicates respectfully with clients and staff at practicum site
- Communicates respectfully with students and faculty in BHSS program
- Responds to feedback constructively.
- Maintains appropriate boundaries with clients.

IV. Cultural Responsiveness

- Demonstrates openness to diverse cultural perspectives.
- Avoids biased or judgmental language.
- Incorporates cultural considerations into treatment planning.

V. Empathy and Client-Centered Behavior

- Actively listens and reflects client feelings accurately.
- Shows genuine concern for client well-being.
- Avoids imposing personal values on clients.
